# MAC, Inc. 2024 President's Report Submitted by Mark Schurr, MAC President October 18, 2024

I would like to thank all the members of the Board for their service this year and to thank Secretary to Angela Collins for her work on the MAC website.

#### **General Activities**

- The Board held several Zoom meetings throughout the year to discuss upcoming conferences, elections, and other issues. There was significant discussion about how to restructure the student paper award. Heather Walder agreed to chair the 2024 Student Paper Award Committee.
- Heather Walder revamped the procedure for selecting the winners of the Student Paper Awards. She developed a rubric that will be used to score presentations and volunteers from the Board will use a Google Sheet to sign up for papers to evaluate and then score them as they are presented at the Conference.
- At our 2022 and 2023 Board meetings, there was discussion about changing the MAC dues structure. No progress was made on this.

#### **Annual Meetings**

- The MAC has agreed to host a joint meeting with the Plains Anthropological Conference in 2025 to be held in Iowa City with John Doershuk serving as our local host.
- The University of Louisville offered to host a meeting in 2026. Aaron Comstock, who would be our local host, explored the possibility of a joint meeting with the Southeastern Archaeological Conference. Although this initially seemed like a good possibility, SEAC was not able to hold a joint meeting in 2026 but can host one with us in 2027.
- In 2023, the Cincinnati Museum of Natural History and Science was willing to consider hosting a
  future meeting that would coincide with a new exhibit somewhere in the 2027-2029 timeframe,
  with 2028 or later being more likely.
- We will therefore need to seek hosts for the 2026 meeting and perhaps consider asking the Cincinnati Museum if they can host in 2028, although his would put two meetings back-to-back in the same part of the Midwest.

#### **Student Travel Award**

• In 2023, Jan Brashler chaired an ad hoc committee on travel support for students attending meetings. The committee proposed establishing a fund of \$20,000 as an endowment and using the annual interest from the fund for student travel awards to support attendance at the annual meeting. The Board accepted that proposal. An anonymous donor has offered to donate \$10,000 to start the fund and if that donation is received, the Board agreed to raise the rest of the funding through various appeals to members. We are currently awaiting the donation.

#### **Midwest Archaeological Perspective Seriees**

In 2022, we were informed by the University of Notre Dame Press that would no longer consider
or publish additional volumes in our Midwest Archaeological Perspectives series, which is closely
tied to the MAC Dissertation Award. I worked with Don Graff to develop a publishing
agreement for the series with the University of Alabama Press. The Board approved the
agreement and Alabama will publish the series going forward. This agreement will be reviewed
every three years.

#### MAC, Inc. 2024 President's Report, Continued

#### Website

- Our webpage is hosted by the University of Iowa and uses a content management system (CMS) called Drupal. We are currently using Version 7 which will no longer be supported in January 2025. We have also been told that the University of Iowa would like us to move our website to another host. Although our website will continue to function, there could be serious security issues in the future.
- After some discussion, the Board considered several options, and decided the easiest path would be to upgrade the website the latest version of Drupal and move it to a new host.
- The people who have been managing the website at the University of Iowa recommend working with Codelift to update the CMS, obtain future technical support, and consider hosting at Pantheon.io. The Board should decide on a pathway forward for the website, and hopefully make any changes before new membership dues are due in January.

#### **2024 Executive Committee Elections/Officer term updates**

• The Nominations Committee consisted of Richard Edwards (Chair) assisted by Susan Kooiman and Gwynn Henderson. They recruited two people to run for Executive Officer and one to run for Editor-Elect. They also obtained candidate statements. Elections closed on October 8, 2024. Please welcome Aaron Comstock (Executive Officer) and Logan Miller (Editor-Elect) to the Board! Eve Hargrave will move from President-Elect to President.

## **2024 Sponsored Symposium**

Emailed membership on May 26, 2024 requesting nominations for the 2024 Distinguished Career Award by July 26, 2024. One nomination was submitted to President Schurr and distributed to the Executive Board for review. The nomination was selected: Timothy R. Pauketat.

#### Social Media

MAC continues to use its Facebook page to share general information, job postings, field schools and other events pertaining to Midwestern Archaeology. Community members also share similar information on the page. Currently, the MAC Facebook has 3,204 followers (an increase of 167 over the past year). Facebook is no longer tracking "likes", but the MAC Facebook page did have over 502 content interactions in the last year, which includes the number of likes or reactions, saves, comments, shares and replies on our content.

MAC continues to use the X (formerly Twitter) feed and currently has 3,185 followers (a decrease of 59 over the past year [traffic on the X platform has declined by approximately 23% since it was rebranded as X in 2022]). The same types of information shared on the MAC Facebook page are also shared via Twitter.

This year continued with the invaluable assistance of our copyeditor Mary Lou Wilshaw-Watts. Her expertise continues to amaze me.

After a year of catchup in 2023, this year we were completely on track from start to finish. Two issues focused on Chicago area precontact and historic archaeology, respectively. And the third contained a series of articles of varying regional and methodological topics.

In 2024, there were a total of 10 submissions, not counting the two themed issues that were under the purview of a guest editor. Of these there were two rejected manuscripts, four have been accepted, and four are under review. The struggle remains to obtain reviewers who complete reviews in a timely fashion; however, many have obviously done so and I am very grateful for this service.

As has been my approach, I will continue to seek out one issue per year focused on a special theme by working with a guest editor when possible. There are two in the works, so we should be right on track over the next two years.

Lastly, at the request of our press, we migrated to a new OJS this year – Scholastica – which has been a great change. The process is much better as a result as we were encountering many glitches in the old system.

My Book Review Editor, Richard Edwards, had one book review published and two more under review. He's expecting an additional three by the end of the year if the reviewers finish on time. He has had two new books sent by publishers in the last three months and has requested another that will be published early next year and already has reviewers lined up. There are still two outstanding reviews from before his tenure, and the authors have expressed an interest in finishing.

In closing, the journal is in good shape, and I am pleased to continue through 2025.

# Annual Report of the Editor Midwest Archaeological Perspectives October 4, 2024

I am pleased to report that after a lengthy delay, the *Midwest Archaeological Perspectives* book series has now been successfully moved to its new publishing home, The University of Alabama Press. In summer 2022, changes at University of Notre Dame Press resulted in the decision to end the press' relationship with *Midwest Archaeological Perspectives*, a process of dissolution that was completed in the summer of 2024. Shortly after receiving notice releasing the series from UND Press, MAC formalized an agree for The University of Alabama Press to take over publication of the series.

Since last year's meeting and after completing the move to a new press, the MAP Series Editor has worked with The University of Alabama Press to migrate "in progress" manuscripts from UND Press to their new home. Both editors—press and series editor—have reviewed existing materials and drafts and then have begun reaching out to these authors. This includes familiarizing authors with the new process that comes from Alabama wherein an author prepares and submits a prospectus for consideration.

Over the past year, the MAP editor only received a few queries about publishing in the series or the dissertation award. With no publisher in place for most of the past year, there has been no active solicitation of dissertations.

In the interests of continuing the *MAP* series and Dissertation Award, the Series Editor, in conjunction with the Editorial Board and MAC leadership, expects the following future activities:

- Discussions at this year's MAC meeting in Milwaukee on timelines and actions, notably
  constituting a new iteration of the editorial board and when to resume the dissertation award.
- The Editor will continue to work with Alabama and authors on moving the first two manuscripts to publication.
- The Editor will look also work with Alabama to get the other two outstanding projects into the publishing pipeline.
